Purposes of the Organization—The Order a "Standing Menace to the Perpetuity of Every Party."

WASHINGTON, May 14.—The most noteworthy feature of today's session of the American Protective Association was the innovation made by inviting to the public the annual address of President W. J. H. Traynor.

"The American Protective Association is today a recognized factor in American politics, whose favor is openly courted by political leaders, organizers and postulators for public office, who, a year or two ago, ignored, treated with contempt or denounced it."
