STEEL RAIL POOL.

Meeting of Manufacturers to Consider Allotments and Percentages. NEW YORK, Dec. 16.—Members of the steel rail pool held a conference here today. Those prominent in the negotiations were Major L. S. Bent, of the Pennsylvania Steel Company; W. E. Seranton, of the Lackawanna Iron and Steel Company; Robert F. Linderman, of the Bethlehem Iron Company, and Mr. Stackhouse, of the Cambria Iron Company. The most important subjects discussed concerned the allotment and percentage matters. Some of the interests represented in the pool have been especially dissatisfied with the percentage arrangement and asked to-day for a more liberal basis. One of the persons interested explained the difficulty by saying that certain parties desired a 150 per cent. distribution when there was only 100 per cent. to be divided. This remark referred chiefly to the arrangement proposed for the coming year, a committee was finally appointed to consider the matter from the standpoint of certain companies.

Although most of the manufacturers represented at to-day's conference are connected with the steel industry, the latter interest was discussed. All those participating in to-day's conference declined to talk about the affairs discussed or to say what the probable outcome of the pending negotiations would be. The following statement was however made: "Several different propositions are being discussed by the manufacturers, and it is important that these referred entirely or indirectly to percentage and distribution matters be settled as early as possible. It is believed that the pool is being successfully managed, and I think in the long run has benefited the condition of the small manufacturer as well as that of the large gas concerns."

Prices to be Cut. PITTSBURG, Dec. 16.—The Post-tomorrow will say it has authority to announce that as a result of the agitation in the steel trade generally, steel rails will be reduced from \$2 to \$1.50. This cut is made to induce more business and to be in line with lower prices in other branches of the steel trade.

ILLEGAL WARRANTS.

Nebraska Sugar Manufacturers Cannot Collect State Bounties.

LINCOLN, Neb., Dec. 16.—The Supreme Court has decided that the payment by State Auditor Moore of some \$48,000 in warrants for sugar bounties to the Oxnard Company is illegal. The opinion was written by Commissioner Irvine and was handed down this afternoon. There was no dissenting opinion filed. The bill passed by the last session of the Legislature provided for the payment of 50 per cent per pound for the state as bounty for all sugar made by new manufacturers and subsequently to the passage of the law. This bounty was made contingent on the manufacturers paying for sugar beets at the rate of \$5 a ton. The bill carried no appropriation for the payment of this bounty, nor was any subsequent appropriation for this purpose made. The manufacturers went ahead and paid \$50,000 for beets, and, along in December last, applied to State Auditor Moore for the accrued bounty. The auditor issued the warrants for \$48,000. PAWNBROKERS FLEECED.

Swindling Scheme Worked by a Jeweler and a Printer.

NEW YORK, Dec. 16.—Pawnbrokers all over this country and Canada have been swindled by an elaborate scheme which was operated from this city as a center. The men engaged in it overworked the fraud when they found it succeeded easily. Two of them have been arrested here. Their names are John Palmer and George Wilson. Palmer says he is a jeweler; Wilson a printer from Philadelphia. The deception was through the pretense that the warrants they offered to pawn were made and cases were offered for sale by standard manufacturers. Detectives discovered the scheme by following the trail to Philadelphia, Brooklyn and Montreal. So far the police estimate that \$20,000 has been lost by Palmer's operations.

MACEO WILL LIVE AGAIN

HE IS NOW REPORTED TO BE IN THE PROVINCE OF MATANZAS.

Festivities at Havana in Celebration of the Cuban's Death, It is Said, Have Been Stopped.

MACEO'S ALLEGED BETRAYER IN CUSTODY OF SPANIARDS AGAIN.

Another "Authentic" Account of the "Killing" of the Insurgent Chief and Young Gomez.

ESCAPE OF A FILIBUSTER

OUR CRUISERS UNABLE TO FIND THE STEAMER THREE FRIENDS.

Fleet of Spanish War Ships on the Lookout for the Elusive Vessel—The Laurada En Route Home.

KEY WEST, Fla., Dec. 16.—Passengers arriving here to-night from Havana report that Antonio Maceo is alive and well in the province of Matanzas. These passengers say that all of the festivities that were going on in Havana to celebrate his death have been ordered stopped since it has become known that he is alive.

It is also reported from Havana that on Dec. 7 the insurgents entered the village of Pinar del Rio, a well-fortified place, where they remained from 11 o'clock at night until 4 o'clock in the morning without firing a shot. They plundered all the stores, carried away great booty and burned a fine mixed store belonging to the Spanish government. It is supposed that the officer of the patrol of the night guard, who is the parent of the insurgent leader Chuché Montenegro, sold out the town, that being the leader who entered and attacked the town.

The war ships Raleigh and Newark came in this noon having failed to find the Three Friends. The steamer City of Key West was overhauled by the Raleigh as she was creeping along near the shore, but the war ship let her alone as soon as she was identified. The Spanish consul here has been really working to Havana about sending a vessel to interfere with the expedition, but it is said by the Cubans that the Bermuda and Three Friends can take care of themselves. The spongers coming in to-day say that Spanish war ships are numerous in the straits between here and Havana, three vessels and six large launches having been sighted.

ZERTUCHA ARRESTED.

Maceo's Alleged Physician in Custody—Weyer to Crucjuda.

HAVANA, Dec. 16.—Captain General Weyer to-day presented \$100 to the scout of Major Crucjuda's column who took away from the body of Antonio Maceo the articles which the Spaniards claim established the identity of the corpse as being that of the insurgent leader. Major Crucjuda, it is officially announced in a dispatch from Punta Brava, dated Dec. 14, congratulates Captain General Weyer on the success of his expedition to deny the false information that General Maceo had been killed. The results obtained were but the natural outcome of his (Crucjuda's) own strict compliance with previous instructions from the captain general and the Marquis Di Ahumada, who acted as captain general during the absence of General Weyer from Havana. Maceo's alleged physician, who is believed to be the same as the man who was reported to have been the "splendid services" which he had rendered to Spain.

The captain of the war ship Reina Cristina, which is stationed at Matanzas, has formally protested to Captain General Weyer against the claim that Maceo crossed the trocha by sea and not by land. Naval officials and those in the coast guard service all resent this claim as a reflection upon the honor of the Spanish government.

Dr. Zertucha, the alleged physician of Maceo who vouches for his death, is again under arrest. The correspondent of the Associated Press at Matanzas reports that the government of Porto Rico, in relieving Captain General Weyer, has refused to resign and he has the confidence of the Queen.

The insurgent propositions contained in Mr. Morgan's resolution in the Senate are replied to by public opinion here. The proposition of Congress, referring to the assassination of Maceo, is considered an interference with rebellion and is felt that it has been completely proved that Maceo died in the front of the fight as soldiers would die.

A mulatto woman named Francisca Herrera will be tried by court-martial to-morrow. She is charged with rebellion and is a central figure in the case. Francisca is described as an amazon and formerly belonged to Castillo's band of insurgents.

PROPOSED LEGISLATION.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 16.—In the course of a heated controversy to-day between Congressman Evans, of Kentucky, and Mr. Proctor, of the Civil-Service Commission, Mr. Evans gave notice that early next session of Congress a bill would be introduced limiting the tenure of office to eight years. He very clearly voiced the opinion of many working members of the party organization that there should be spots to distribute to the winners of the great political battle. The McKinley administration has been accused of having tried to give out to those who worked hardest for the success of the party, which is considered an injustice by the so-called abolitionists, and there is a demand for a change in the public crib which will be hard to satisfy if conditions exist. It is shown by the talk that the incoming President will be powerless to change provisions by modifying or changing the orders that have been issued.

The bill which will be enacted into a law in its early formative stages in the ways and means committee of the House, in the meantime, will be reported by the committee and in all human probability will become a law. Chairman Dingley has put a quietus on all prophesy foreshadowing the passage of the bill during the present term of Congress. He says there is no disposition to press the bill and a special session of Congress is called to consider it.
