All Volunteers to Return. Volunteers Returning on the Grant. FARGO, N. D., July 8.—A private cablegram received here this afternoon from a member of the North Dakota regiment says the regiment left Manila to-day for home on the transport Grant. The Idaho and Wyoming regiments accompany them.

WILL SOON ADJOURN. Peace Conference May Close This Month and Resemble Next Spring.
