THE CITY HEALTH BOARD

MAKES SEVERAL APPOINTMENTS IN THAT DEPARTMENT.

Several Ordinances Are in Contemplation by the Board—City Affairs of Interest.

The City Board of Health met yesterday afternoon and took up the question of appointments which was not discussed at the meeting of the board in the morning.

At the morning session of the board the officers and the inspectors and proceeded to fill the vacancies. Dr. Pritchard was appointed met inspector and he will take office Jan. 1; Henry Langenberg was appointed met inspector, to take office at once; Henry Decker and Joseph McDonnell were made cemetery officers, to begin their duties next Monday; William Gibson and Bernard Aldering were appointed health officers, but they do not take office until Jan. 1.

The board also appointed Anson Masset as chemist, to take office immediately. At the morning session of the board the posthouse question was considered and the only site discussed was Sellers farm, where the city garbage is now disposed of.

An ordinance to regulate the removal of dead animals was discussed. It was proposed by the city attorney and it is the purpose to make it illegal for any one but the city contractor to remove dead animals.

Ordinances regulating the cleaning of vaults and cutting of weeds will also be drawn by the board. It is the intention to make the new ordinances place power in the hands of the Board of Health whereby the cleaning of vaults and cutting of weeds can be done by the city and the cost assessed against the property owners.

The board also awarded the contracts for the telephone service for the coming year to the Central Union Company, the bid being \$2 for the three telephones. The New Telephone Company bid \$25.
