PAID OUT IN SALARIES FIGURES COMPILED BY DEPUTY STATISTICIAN MACHAN. The Expenses of County Government in Indiana—Report Deals with 1899 and 1900.

Citizens of Indiana who have a desire to learn what disposition is made of the money they pay for the expenses of county government will in a few days have the means at hand with which to gratify that desire.

The total amount paid clerks of Circuit Courts last year was \$228,186.96, and for 1899 the amount was \$209,386.19, showing an excess in 1899 over 1900 of \$118,799.77.

With the nearly complete figures at hand, the report of the statistician shows that these five county officials of Indiana were in 1900 paid an excess of \$50,882.41 over 1899.

SALES OF SUPERINTENDENTS. The total amount paid to county superintendents of schools last year was \$109,465.96. The highest salary, as shown by the report, was paid to the superintendent of Pike county, who drew \$1,960.
