Vote to be Taken on Tuesday at 3 p. m., and No Filibustering Will Be Permitted.

PROGRAMME OF THE SENATE

CESSION TREATY WITH DENMARK PROBABLY WILL BE RATIFIED.

Report by Mr. Corliss on His Bill for Government Ownership of the Proposed Pacific Cable.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 16.—The coming week promises to be one of unusual activity in the House of Representatives.

Without intervening motion to recommit or amend, the bill passed by a vote of 171 to 137. The bill was then taken up, with two days for debate, and a stringent special rule bringing the bill to a vote at 3 p. m. on Tuesday.

The Indian appropriation bill will be taken up on Wednesday, with two other appropriation bills, the diplomatic and consular and the post office, revenue.

The greater part of the day on Monday will be devoted by the Senate to an effort to ratify the Danish treaty.

PROPOSED PACIFIC CABLE.

Government Ownership Strongly Advocated by Representative Corliss.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 16.—The report to be filed to-morrow by the House committee on interstate and foreign commerce recommending the passage of the bill introduced by Representative Corliss providing for government ownership of a Pacific cable, says that the United States, by the annexation of Hawaii and the acquisition of the Philippines and other islands, through the ratification of the Paris treaty, assumed the responsibility of maintaining peace in the Pacific ocean.

REV. T. M. GUILD, OF HUNTINGTON. About 8500 Raised at Hyde Park Church for the Fund. The Rev. T. M. Guild, of the First M. E. Church of Huntington, preached yesterday morning at the Hyde Park M. E. Church, on Thirtieth street. At the morning and evening services together about \$500 was raised there for the Methodist hospital fund. At the morning service \$200 was pledged after Mr. Guild had delivered an address on the necessity of applied Christianity. It was not sufficient, he said, that the State should maintain hospitals, because in the State hospitals the souls of sufferers were not looked after according to the Methodist beliefs. The church should have both schools and hospitals in order that its dominion might be extended.
