MONROE FATALLY SHOT CHARLES HUBBARD FIRED AT HIM AFTER SOME PROVOCATION.

The Men Had Met Previously, It is Said, and Prepared Themselves for an Encounter.

AN EARLY MORNING AFFRAY

WOUNDED MAN AT ONCE TAKEN TO THE CITY HOSPITAL.

Hubbard Held for the Shooting and Another Man as a Witness—All Are Colored.

Gus Monroe, thirty years old, a colored laborer, living at 515 West Fourteenth street, is in the City Hospital, suffering from the effects of a bullet fired into his intestines by Charles Hubbard, aged forty-four years, also colored, during a quarrel at Indiana avenue and New York street at daybreak yesterday.

The affray is attributed to Monroe's imagining that Hubbard had "peached" something about him to Patrolman Montgomery, with whom Hubbard was talking a few minutes before the shooting occurred.

After roll call at police headquarters yesterday morning Patrolman Montgomery started home, on Indiana avenue he met Hubbard, who had returned from Monroe on Saturday.

Monroe fell to the pavement wounded, the blood pouring from his right side. The shots aroused the neighborhood, and in a few minutes a crowd gathered.
