ASSAILANT HAS ESCAPED

Serious Injury of Union Traction Employes on a Car Running from Anderson to Muncie.

DALEVILLE MEN IN JAIL

MUNCIE, Ind., Feb. 15.—A fight on the Indiana Union Traction car, due in Muncie at 1:30 o'clock this morning, between men from Daleville, Ira and Frank Neff, on one side, and Elmer Irons, conductor, and Dave French, motorman, on the other, resulted in serious injury to both the motorman and conductor. The Neff brothers spent yesterday in Anderson and drank heavily. Last night, coming into Muncie, Conductor Irons demanded the fare of Roy Helvie, a companion of the Neff brothers. Helvie said he had lost his ticket and refused to pay his fare. When Conductor Irons attempted to put him off the car trouble ensued. Irons was dragged from the car and in the darkness was cut six times with a knife in the hands of one of the Neffs. Motorman French went to the rescue of his fellow-employe with his motor-crank and drove the assailants away. He helped Irons on the car and started it. The Neffs and other Daleville passengers threw stones at the car, smashing several windows. One stone hit Motorman French in the ear, stunning him and almost tearing off his ear. The men came to Muncie and were taken at once to the Whitney Hospital. Irons was very weak from the loss of blood. His most serious wound is a stab in the abdomen. The Muncie police were notified and the traction company placed a special car at the disposal of the officers. Six patrolmen were sent to Anderson on charges of beating the Neff brothers. Others will be arrested as soon as the necessary evidence is obtained. The Muncie police on charges of attacking and beating Frank Neff on a simple assault and battery charge.
