

RAID OF A NEGRO BRIGADE IN NORTH CAROLINA. Three Thousand Slaves Liberated.

THE REBELS ON THE MOVE. The Garrison at Petersburg Captured.

THE UNION FORCES DRIVEN OUT OF BURLINGTON. Cumberland Threatened.

MUCH EXCITEMENT PREVAILS. Washington News and Rumors.

From New York. New York, January 8.—A letter to the Times gives an interesting account of the expedition of the negro brigade into North Carolina.

The guerrillas lost 13 in killed and wounded. Ten dwellings, with many thousands of bushels of corn, were burned, besides two distilleries, four rebel camps destroyed, and one guerrilla hung.

Our loss was 12 killed and wounded, one taken prisoner, and four hostages.

A special to the Herald dated Cumberland, Md., January 8, says: The garrison at Petersburg, West Virginia, surrendered to-day. Fitzhugh Lee and Rosser are moving between New Creek and Petersburg.

Cumberland is threatened, and much excitement prevails here. It seems probable we will be attacked by to-morrow morning.

Passenger trains on the railroad have stopped running, but the other trains continue, unless the enemy yesterday captured a train of 36 wagons.

The rebels are reported to be moving in three main columns. Insurrections have been attacked at Winchester and driven back. So far everything is in our favor.

A special to the Times dated Washington, Jan. 8, says: The Committee on Ways and Means is in session to-day, engaged in considering amendments to the internal revenue bill.

It is stated that if the committee advance the tax on whisky only to the figure mentioned by the Secretary and Commissioner—that is, 60 cents per gallon, as at the latest advance they were disposed to do—an effort will be made in the House to add 40 cents more, making \$1 per gallon.

Gen. Hancock, who has been assigned to the command of the 3d corps, is ordered to report to the War Department, and Gen. Warren is again placed in command of the corps.

Under the decision of Secretary Chase the payment of the 7 3/4 treasury notes will be made in legal currency of the United States, unless the resumption of specie payment takes place before that time.

Should holders desire they can convert their notes into 6 per cent. 20 year bonds, the interest and principal of which are payable in coin.

A special to the World dated Washington the 8th, says: The Senate debated the conscription act most of the day, but reached no conclusion on any amendment. But one Senator favored the repeal of the \$300 clause, while all the others who spoke opposed such repeal.

Indications are, that not more than one-third of the Senators are in favor of its repeal.

During the debate on the conscription bill in the Senate to-day an important fact came out: that the terms of enlistment of only 20,000 volunteers expire before the 1st of July next in all our armies.

A special to the Times dated Washington the 8th, says: The reciprocity treaty got its first notice to-day by a resolution introduced in the Senate to terminate it. It is understood that there is a sufficient Canadian lobby here to maintain present arrangements in force.

Engineer Isherwood was again under examination to-day before the Committee on Ways and Means, to aid that body in saving waste national money in bad ships and worse engines. He will be called again next week.

Ice has rendered Johnson's Island no longer an island, and fears have been entertained of a new attempt on the part of the rebel officers confined there to effect their escape. To meet any movement of this kind a large force has been sent to that point.

From Washington. WASHINGTON, January 8.—The Senate to-day confirmed the nomination of H. L. Fletcher of Minnesota, as Receiver of Public Money for the District of Minnesota.

January 9.—The Star says: The President has ordered a court martial for the trial of Surgeon General Hammond, under charges of fraud and malpractice, preferred by the committee that not long since examined into the affairs of his office.

From Cincinnati. CINCINNATI, January 9.—The War Democrats of Ohio held a meeting at Columbus yesterday. No nominations made.

Gov. Bramlette of Kentucky yesterday sent a message to the Senate urging the immediate necessity of raising troops for the defense of the State.

Snow covered the ground at Chattanooga yesterday. Gen. Thomas has issued an order assessing \$30,000 on rebel sympathizers living within ten miles of the recent number of three soldiers, near Malvern, Tenn; the money to be divided among the families of the soldiers killed.

From Concord, N. H. CONCORD, January 9.—The New Hampshire Democratic Convention met here to-day. The attendance was quite large and the proceedings harmonious. Resolutions generally condemning the policy of the present Administration were adopted.

From Baltimore. BALTIMORE, January 8.—Ex Gov. Hicks was to-day elected United States Senator to fill the unexpired term of Senator Deane, to which he had been appointed by the Governor.

From Buffalo. BUFFALO, January 9.—A snow storm, accompanied by high wind, is raging here to-day. Thermometer 75 above.
