National Democratic Platform of 1864.

THE UNION—THE CONSTITUTION—PEACE—PUBLIC LIBERTY—PRIVATE RIGHTS—FREE ELECTIONS—A FREE PRESS—FREE SPEECH—TRIAL BY JURY—THE RIGHT OF ASYLUM—JUSTICE TO OUR SOLDIERS.

Resolved, That in the future, as in the past, we will adhere with unswerving fidelity to the Union under the Constitution as the only foundation of our strength, security and happiness as a people, and as a framework of government equally conducive to the welfare and prosperity of the States, both North and South.

Resolved, That this Convention does explicitly declare, as the sense of the American people, that after four years of failure to restore the Union by the use of military force, during which the pretense of military necessity or of power higher than the Constitution, and public liberty and private right alike trodden down, and the material property of the country essentially injured, justice, humanity, liberty and the public welfare demand that immediate and complete restoration of the Union, and that a new and permanent basis of government be established, to the end that at the earliest practicable moment peace may be restored on the basis of the Federal Union of the States.

Resolved, That the direct interference of the military arm of the States in the recent elections, and the employment of unusual test oaths, and the interference with the right of the people to assemble for the purpose of discussing the merits of the Government, and the restoration of the Union and the perpetuation of the Government, are the most heinous crimes known to the history of the Republic.

Resolved, That the shameful disregard of the Administration to its duty in respect to our fellow citizens who now are, and long have been, prisoners of war in a section of the country, and who are being held in the score alike of public policy and common humanity.

Resolved, That the sympathy of the Democratic party is hereby and earnestly extended to the soldiers of our army and sailors of our navy who are and have been in the field and on the sea, under the flag of their country, and in the event of their attaining power, they will redouble all the care, protection and regard that the brave soldiers and sailors of the Republic have so nobly earned.
