From New York.
New York, May 17.—The Herald's Chester S. C. correspondent says:
The rebel Gen. Vance, of North Carolina, was arrested in Buncombe county last Friday by a detachment of Kilpatrick's cavalry, by orders from Washington, whether it is said he will be sent to stand his trial for treason.

It was reported that another detachment of cavalry was in pursuit of Gov. McGrath, of North Carolina.
The rebel Gen. Joe Johnston is at Charlotte, N. C. It is said he applied for permission to be allowed to go to Canada, but had been refused.

The pirate Capt. Semmes, with some companions, is endeavoring to reach the coast and make his escape out of the country by the sea.
The Herald's Richmond correspondent writes as follows:
The capture of Jeff Davis was read there by the old residents and the rebellion sympathizers with the greatest astonishment and deepest sense of the humiliation of their traitorous cause.

The Herald's Washington correspondent has the following:
Gov. J. H. Pierpont, of Virginia, has issued an address to the voters of the 1st, 2d, and 7th congressional districts of that state on the subject of the election. The 10th Tuesday, May is the regular election day, but, as the districts above named are not thoroughly organized, no elections can be held by the laws of Virginia.

The executive is empowered to call special elections to fill vacancies.
Gov. Pierpont, therefore, advises no polls to be opened for members of congress, either in the counties already organized or in those to be organized; assuring the people that as soon as the county officers in the organized portions are elected, he will order a special election for the absent named districts. There will be a fair opportunity to those who are not organized.

By the way of Havana we learn that the rebel leaders in Texas and Western Louisiana were meeting their determination to carry on the war notwithstanding the failure of their cause in the east.
Gen. Magruder made a speech on the 24th in which he announced that he could see nothing discouraging for the rebels in the military situation, mysteriously hinting that they had a right to bear at hand, regarding whom, he did not feel at liberty to say anything further at the time.

Old Sterling Price of Missouri and Gen. Hindman of Arkansas, are both said to be still alive and in Texas.
The rebel blockade runner and pirate Owl, Capt. Maffit, arrived at Havana from Galveston on the 15th inst. The former is a gentleman well known in the city, with 1000 bales of cotton on board has reached Matanzas.

The Times' Special says of the visit of the military commission to the theatre:
It was found that the theatre, after falling on the stage, to get out of the building a distance of ninety feet. The passage was six feet wide, entirely unobstructed, and is on a level with the ground, in the rear of the building, so the assassin had no steps to ascend or descend. There is a narrow hall leading from the stage on the south side of the theatre, on both streets on which the building fronts. It was at the front door of this hall that Booth, Spangler, and another man, whose names are not yet to the evidence, were engaged in the mysterious whispering and manoeuvring which attracted the attention of Sergeant James M. Dyer, as detailed by him in his testimony yesterday. Everything remains undisturbed inside the building, except as it was at the time of the assassination, just as the chair in which Mr. Lincoln sat when he was shot has been taken away, and the blue flag which hung in front of the box, in which Booth's spur caught, has been removed.

The World's Washington special says:
The president has resented Bowles and Milligan, the Indiana conspirators.
The steamer Scotia took out to day nearly a million dollars, and three hundred passengers.
Key West advises that the steamer Columbia, which arrived there from Havana, reported to our authorities that the pirate Stonewall was hurriedly receiving to exceed and ammunition from the Owl and other confederate steamers and blockade runners. Capt. John Maffit had as usual command of the Stonewall.

WASHINGTON, May 17.—It is understood that the president yesterday resented the sentence of the Indiana conspirators, Bowles and Milligan, from Friday on to the 21st of June, and commuted that of Henry to imprisonment for life.
