

INVESTMENT. Saturday Evening, June 17, 1865. Money is still close. The action of the banks in placing the notes of the State at a discount looks up a good deal of currency. And the money paid out to soldiers is not returning through the channels of trade as rapidly as was anticipated. We quote the ruling rates as heretofore from banks 10 to 12 per cent. and at street from 12 to 15 per cent.

Trade generally through the week has been quiet, although the grocery houses have been turning out a good many bills. There is but little change in the quotations this week; the advance in gold has had the tendency to stiffen the prices of all leading articles.

We quote an advance in wheat of five cents a bushel. There has been but little coming in during the week. The sales of lumber have been larger than usual, indicating a disposition to build at the reduced rates. Brick are offered at \$1 per thousand.

The reports in regard to the crops are generally favorable. The wheat harvest in the southern part of the State, and the yield will be good. If the weather is favorable the wheat will be cut in the central part of the State next week. The accounts in regard to corn are conflicting. The late planted is, without doubt, backward, but the warm weather lately is bringing it forward rapidly. The result will, however, depend in a great degree upon favorable weather in the fall. The prospect for fruit are good, and in some portions of the State the yield will be unusually large.

The large payments to discharged soldiers do not stimulate trade as much as was expected. The soldiers do not part with their money as freely as heretofore, but are anxious to be paid for and get home as speedily as possible. Instead of investing their money here, they take it home, and will return through the local trade slowly. This increases the prospects for a healthy and steady trade during the summer and fall.
