By the arrival, on Saturday, of the steamship El Dorado, Captain Gray, from Aspinwall, and the Daniel Webster, Captain Womack, from San Juan Del Norte, we have received fifteen days' later intelligence from California and later dates from the Istimus and the South Paolie.
