On the 24th a Turkish flying corps crossed the Danube below Silistria, in order to destroy the Russian strand batteries. They advanced with much loss, the Turks fought bravely, but being overmatched, were ultimately forced to retire.

Authentic accounts to April 23 confirm that Silistria had been exposed to repeated and violent attacks, but up to the above date was unharmed. Constantinople, April 24.—The Russian batteries at the Sulina, mouth of the Danube, have been bombarded by parts of the allied fleet.

It is reported that the Russian fleet put to sea from Sebastopol on the 26th April. The fleet has offered to Prussia a treaty of commerce on the most favorable terms. No action is yet taken on it.

It is again positively asserted that the French army of the East will be augmented to 100,000 men. The formation of a camp of 60,000 at Bonaparte, with a view to an expedition to the Baltic, is also spoken of.

The following important dispatch was telegraphed from Vienna, of date May 8. It is contained in Bulletin de la Presse on the 18th or 19th of April. Omar Pasha advanced with 70,000 men towards the Dobruzda, and a battle took place with Luder's corps between Silistria and Rasseva.

European News by the Europe.

The steamship Europa arrived at New York from Liverpool on the afternoon of the 18th inst. The allied fleets had sailed from Sebastopol. Omar Pasha had won great victories on land over the Russians.

Gen. Lee's Grape Shot has turned out to be a Russian prisoner, and has captured a French merchantman within sight of the British coast. Several English steamers were sent to capture her.

Sir Charles Napier, with the line-of-battle ships under Admirals Corvey and Chads, were keeping up a rigorous blockade of the Gulf of Finland, which would render the escape of a single Russian ship impossible.

A most formidable force of row-boats is being organized by the Russians to harass the invading fleet, for the shallow waters. Eight hundred armed boats are already enrolled.

Napier is so well aware of the formidable nature of this force that he has hastily applied to his Government for a fleet of small steamers that may penetrate wherever row-boats can.

A severe battle has been fought between the Turks and Greeks, in which the latter were routed with much loss. With the exception of the Piræus, all the coasts of Greece are rigidly watched by the French and English ships-of-war.

Pirates are swarming in the Archipelago. An English brig had drifted ashore on the island of Andros; there was no one on board, but the cabins were drenched with blood.

Odesa was successfully bombarded—all the batteries and magazines were destroyed; 12 Russian ships-of-war were sunk by the allied fleet, and 18 ammunition and storehouses were taken.
