FURTHER BY THE PACIFIC. FORCE OF THE ALLIES AT SEBASTOPOL.

Liverpool Markets. New York, Oct. 30.—The Circular of Messrs. Milligan, Evans & Co. reports the sales of Cotton at Liverpool since the departure of the Niagara at 20,000 bales; of which 5,000 had been taken for speculation, and 5,000 for export.

The Allies before Sebastopol are 90,000 strong. There is nothing further of any interest from the seat of war.

ARRIVAL OF THE STEAMSHIP CAHAWA. RAPID PASSAGE FROM NEW YORK VIA HAVANA. The United States Mail Steamship Cahawa, B. W. Sherford Commander, arrived here this morning at 2 o'clock, having crossed the Bar of Pass-a-Loutre yesterday afternoon at half past 4 o'clock from New York via Havana.

The Cahawa left New York at 12 m. on the 25th ult., and reached Havana at 12 m. on the 28th, making the run in just five days. She left Havana the same afternoon at 3 1/2, and arrived at the Bar Pass-a-Loutre at 4 1/2, on November 1st, having made the run in three days and ten hours.
