OUR EUROPEAN RELATIONS.

Our existing relations with three of the great powers of Europe are far from being of the most amicable or friendly character. We do not deem it likely that the present differences will ripen into anything serious, and yet it must be admitted that grave consequences have originated in matters of less moment and are within the scope of possibility in the present instance.

Since the origin of the Eastern war the English press has assumed towards this country a tone of language which cannot be considered other than highly offensive. Members of Parliament, standing in their places, have intimated that the Anglo-French alliance looked to a Western as well as an Eastern question—implying, very distinctly, an interference with matters on this continent, which the Monroe doctrine, so often asserted and reasserted as to be actually incorporated into the policy of the nation, has declared inadmissible.

We invite attention to the letter of Col. Garland, the City Treasurer, which we give below. The letter was read before the Council on Tuesday night by the Finance Committee. As it refers to matters of general interest we should have been pleased to publish the accompanying statements, but have not the room to spare this morning.
