UNIVERSITY OF LOUISIANA.
We have received from a committee of the Board of Administrators of the University of Louisiana, a report upon the condition and progress of the College of Law, the most important and progressive educational institution of the State, which is interesting and valuable for the cause of education in this region and the information it furnishes upon the subject in general. The committee recommends the adoption of the entire system of degrees in proficiency now in use in the University of Virginia, that the State Legislature be advised by members from the Board and from the citizens of New Orleans, making the sum of \$100,000 appropriated and safely invested for the establishment and support of the Department of Literature, General Science and the Arts, in the University of Louisiana. The suggestion is also thrown out that the grant be made conditional upon the subscription by the citizens of this city of a similar sum.
