THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES.

We come next to the report of the Hon. Hamilton Fish, of New York, an ex-Governor of that State and for many years a Senator in Congress.

Gov. Fish, though young usually with the President, is a man of remarkable moderation in his political views. During the whole of the Kansas excitement he had nothing to say. Indeed, it was rarely he addressed the Senate on any question.

He was discharged of his duties as one of the Committee on Foreign Affairs, and of the Committee on Naval Affairs, and in attention to the multitudinous wants of his constituents, he passed most of his time.

While his political position is, it would be hard to determine. A few years ago he was an Union man, but he occasionally assumes the character of the most voracious fire-eater. In the meantime, he takes good care to have an anchor to windward by supporting the Democratic party in everything.

It is supposed to be that of running with the hare and holding with the hounds. While keeping in favor with the Democratic party proper, he also keeps in the good graces of the States Rights Union. He is not general in his political position, as well as in sentiment. In short, he is a compromise man.

I suppose he also may be considered a life member of the Senate. In No. 5 of this series I inadvertently stated that Mr. Hart, of Iowa, was confirmed in his seat in the Senate by a vote of that body. This was an error.

He was elected by a small majority, but was immediately re-elected by the Legislature of his State.
