London, July 11.—Sugar closed dull after a decline of 6d to 1s.

The weather has been favorable for crops since our last report.

General News. The Indian mail confirms the late account of the mutiny of the natives in the Bengal army.

Reinforcements are to be sent from England immediately.

The ballot question has been defeated in the House of Commons.

Two serious railroad accidents had occurred in England, by which 27 persons were killed and about a hundred wounded.

It is reported that France will immediately send fourteen transports of troops to China.

Advices from Singapore state that the difficulty between the American and British authorities, respecting the Dutch ship Henrietta Maria, is still unsettled.

Spain. The Spanish-Mexican question is no longer settled.

Forty conspirators had been arrested.

England and India. Lord Granville stated in Parliament that 40,000 troops would be sent to India to suppress the insurrection, and to provide for future security.

He confirms the published accounts of the Ministry and said that the principal motive for the move was the impression that there was to be an attempt at their general conversion to Christianity.
