ARRIVAL OF THE ANGLO-SAXON. FOUR DAYS LATER FROM EUROPE. THE CITY OF WASHINGTON. COMMERCIAL INTELLIGENCE. LIVERPOOL, AUGUST 12.—The sales of Cotton for the last three days amount to 17,000 bales, of which 10,000 were for export and 7,000 for home consumption.
