The Louisiana Manufacturing Company.

Chief among the enterprises of the South, and the one which, if properly encouraged and extensively carried out, would contribute more than anything else to the stability and independence of the Southern States, is the manufacture of cotton. Here and there, throughout the South, are cotton mills, which have done and are doing a business so prosperous that we can scarcely understand why they do not increase more rapidly. The raw material is at hand, the expense of transportation, and operations are easily to be had to any extent and as cheaply as can reasonably be desired. It is in a city like New Orleans that we should judge the cotton manufacture capable of being carried on with the greatest facility and with the largest profit.

The material is here in oceans, fresh and loose from the fields; the cost of setting up a factory is a matter so easily surmounted here as in any other part of the country; and as to operations, our suburbs swarm with poor children, growing up in idleness—who, though poor, are still very far removed from the squalid poverty and starvation of the North—and who could easily be procured, and employed with benefit to themselves and their families. It is therefore evident to us, that all that is requisite to place the South on a footing of entire independence in the cotton manufacture, is a proper encouragement on the part of her menaced men—a spirit which recognizes no half-measures, and knows no such word as fail.

This matter has been revived in our mind by the discovery of a fact of which we were not previously aware, when, a day or two since, we paid a visit to the mills of the Louisiana Manufacturing Company, the corner of Harmony and Levee streets, Fourth District. That establishment, we know, had for years been engaged successfully and profitably in the manufacture of hemp rope; but we did not know until we visited it the other day, that it had engaged in cotton-spinning likewise. It is less than two years since the Company, by way of experiment, undertook the cotton branch of the spinning business; and though they have not gone into it extensively, they have, nevertheless, had ample demonstration that the cotton manufacture would thrive here, as well as in any other part of the country or world, if it is not a great deal better.

The factory is a very large and massive brick building, three stories high, fronting on Harmony, Levee and Water streets. Under the polite guidance of the Superintendent, we went all through it. An object which we were bound to admire, on entering, was the engine in the basement, a very large beam engine, recently built by the Messrs. Levee and Water. The engine is at least twenty feet high, has six feet stroke and a thirty-six inch cylinder. It is, we believe, the largest stationary engine in the South; and though it propels all the machinery in the building, creating a whizzing thunder on every side, it moves itself with less noise than that of a parlor sewing-machine. It is altogether a magnificent piece of machinery, and being visible from the street, it is the name of a constant spurting of the passing crowd.
