**TALK ON CHANGE.**  
The talk for two days past has been that general trade does not move along with that briskness and liveliness the position of affairs would seem to warrant, that is, from the line hygienic state of the city, the large stocks of produce, and the redundancy of money. However, it is best not to move too far. The receipts of cotton continue on a large scale, which, with the daily arrivals of steamers from the great West, keep part of the levee totally crowded. The talk is, that some of the correspondents from Northern cities gather rather overcast as regards cotton, talking of Midgling in Liverpool receding to fight. The Chinese war, or the troubles in China, are regarded with some fears; but large quantities of cotton from Bombay for the China market will be diverted to England. The receipts of cotton continue on a free scale. The weather continues favorable for picking and drying. A small, though not a great deal, of corn, wheat and rye, and greatly deficient crops; in others that there is more cotton raised; then, again, we have hoisting and hauling accounts from planters of how much cotton Jack picked in a day; how much little Jim gathered, and what a grand day's work little Dolly performed in picking four hundred and seventy pounds in nine hours. The receipts of cotton, however, tend to create the impression among the dealers that the present crop will be something above an average. In the meantime, there was some talk about sugar. There is no talk of any grinding of cane as yet, though on the 20th September last year there were received at the levee three highlands of new crop.

**A TOUCHING CASE OF DISTRESS** came up before Recorder Long yesterday. Mrs. Josephine Miller, a poor woman living at the corner of Mandeville and Goodchild streets, appeared in Court, weeping, pleading for the hand of charity for a little girl five years old, nearly the only German common was along, also weeping. The cause of this distress was so apparent; the little girl, pretty and tender-looking as she was, showed herself to be wildly insane, raving mad. Her behavior and her mad screams were perfectly appalling. Every moment she would spring like a cat at her mother, with shouts and screams; then jump up and down, stamp the floor with her little feet alternately, and try to tear her hair; refusing to be comforted, and to not touching anybody or appearing to have the least spark of reason. Her conduct was such that her mother had to take her out of Court while the affidavit of insanity was being made. The old German woman said the child had been that way for two years; slept but little, ate her food by compulsion, and kept the house in a filthy state; she lived distressed day and night, and her screams were so loud and so long, that she had to be taken to the hospital. The mother was broken-hearted to find her child becoming worse and more unmanageable, and to know that she would have to part with her. The Dutchman was weeping for the mother: "Oh, that poor woman and baby," he said. "I feel for you, but I cannot do anything for you." She told her, in reply to the mother, she had taken the child to the hospital, and how her husband made her take the child back because he could not sleep at night for her. The child is said to have become crazy originally under the medical treatment for teething. The little sufferer was sent to the Insane Asylum, where she will certainly be a piteous and most troublesome charge.

**FRANCIS SPENCER'S** outrageous doings by squads of young men at night in the back part of the Second District, continue to reach us. We hear that a number of them went to a house where there was a party the other night, and were refused admission; as they had no tickets, they went away; but at a later hour returned, broke into the house, made the inmates scatter in every direction, and caught and cruelly beat and kicked a man. We have also several accounts of persons being stopped on the streets and searched and rubbed by parties of young men unknown to them. These may not be the same young men whom Lieut. Gastineau admitted went along in disguise, on a harmless frolic; but whoever they are, the police should make it their special ambition to get after them and if possible catch them and bring them to punishment.
