NEW YORK, Nov. 8.—The steamship Vanderbilt of the Harve and Southwestern line, arrived at this port last night. She left Havre on Wednesday, the 24th inst. Her commercial articles have been fully anticipated by the North American, at Quebec.

Recent heavy and long continued rains have caused a great inundation in the South of France, which has destroyed a considerable amount of property and many lives.

The British Government is very much opposed to the Spanish war with Morocco, especially on account of the cooperation of France in alliance with Spain, which, in its opinion, will weaken the British power in the Mediterranean.

The London Times expresses the opinion that the apprehensions entertained by the Government that the Spanish expedition against Morocco will endanger the peace of Europe, is absurd; but it continues, an attack by France upon the independence of Morocco, or any attempt to annex Morocco to Algeria, would justify the strongest measures in behalf of Europe as well as England.

The London Times expresses the opinion that the alliance between France and Spain, in its opinion, is anything but a desirable one, and that the British Government should be endeavoring to make it an European question.

The Paris correspondent of the London Times says that the convention recently concluded between Palmerston and the French Ambassador caused much sensation at Paris, which the British Government asserted that France would not change its policy in relation to Morocco.

The Spanish Government has requested the disavowal of any ambitious projects which have been attributed to her in connection with the Morocco war.

The London News says that the Spanish Minister had sent a dispatch to Madrid stating that England, no longer opposed the expedition against Morocco.

Great preparations are being made throughout Germany for the Schiller festival.

The Prussian Minister of Police has refused to allow a torchlight procession at Berlin, as the Government fears that it would be the occasion of a democratic demonstration.

The reports circulated in regard to an intended interview between the Emperor of Russia and Austria are unfounded.

Advices from Calcutta to the 24th of September have been received in England but they comprise nothing of special importance.

It was reported that Nens Sahib was dying of fever.

Massachusetts State Election.

DORSET, Nov. 8.—The election for State officers was held to-day in this State and passed off quietly.

The Republicans have elected their ticket by about the same majority as last year.

Trial of the Harper's Ferry Outlaws.

CHARLESTON, Va., November 8.—The trial of Stephens, one of old Brown's associates, was commenced to-day.

The Court is proceeding to empanel a jury, when a telegraph dispatch was received from Governor Wise, suggesting to the prosecuting authorities to proceed against Stephens, in order to bring prominent Northern men and some of the Abolition fanatics, who were cognizant of Brown's movements, as witnesses before the United States Court, the authorities of Virginia having no authority to summon witnesses from other States.

According to the suggestion, Mr. Hunter, the prosecuting officer, handed Stephens over to the United States Marshal for trial.

Arrest of Another Harper's Ferry Outlaw.

MAXIMUS, Nov. 8.—W. R. Palmer, who is charged with having been an accessory in the late Harper's Ferry riot, was arrested here to-day. He is confined in the city jail awaiting a requisition from Gov. Wise.
