PORTLAND, March 2.—The steamship Anglo-Saxon, of the Canadian line, has arrived at this city on the 21st inst., and is to be touched at Queenstown on Thursday, the 16th inst.

Commercial advices, however, have been fully anticipated by the Edinburgh, of Cape Race, which left Queenstown on the same day.

The reply of the Austrian Government to the proposition of England for the settlement of the Italian question has reached Paris, and its general purport has been known.

Prince Gortschakoff, the Russian Minister of Foreign Affairs, says, in his dispatch to the English Government, that Austria cannot retract from the solemn engagements entered into by her with regard to the Italian question, and that she will not be able to support the experiment about being made in Central Italy by force of arms.

WASHINGTON, March 2.—In the House, to-day, the appropriation bill to carry out the stipulations of the treaty with the Indians in Washington and Oregon Territories, was taken up and passed.

The House then proceeded to the election of a member from the Territory of California.

The vote upon this bill was as follows: Total number of votes cast, 183, of which Ford received 103, and Colfax 80.

Mr. Colfax, on behalf of the Committee on Post-Office and Post-Roads, reported a bill authorizing the printing of the laws of the United States.

Mr. Douglass takes strong grounds in favor of Stephen A. Douglas, and advocates his nomination for the Presidency by the Charleston Convention.
