The week opened very quietly yesterday. The European advices up to the 18th of April were before the public on Saturday before meridian, and the influence was perceptible yesterday.

TRIUMPH OF THE DOUGLAS PARTY.

Several dispatches received on Saturday, which were anything but encouraging. There was talk of hills being noted for non-acceptance; there was talk of failures; there was talk of other matters.
