BY THE STEAMSHIP ADRIFATIC.

NEW YORK, AUG. 11.—The European mails by the steamship Adrifatic, from Southampton and Havre, left here, were fully delivered today, and those intended for the Southern cities were sent off by this evening's train.

The Hamburg American packet Bavaria, from New York via Southampton and Havre, arrived out at Hamburg on the 23rd ult.

The Conard Royal mail steamship Etes, from New York, arrived out at Liverpool previous to the departure of the Adrifatic.

LAURELTON, Aug. 11.—Messrs. J. M. Hewitt & Co., report by the Adrifatic that the business in cotton, since the departure of the Europa, was only moderate. They estimate the sales of Tuesday at 8000 bales, and quote Middling Orleans at 5 1/2.

The quantity of Cotton at sea is 3,000 bales, against 6,000 corresponding period last year.

Messrs. James Hewitt & Co., say that the Flour market is slightly easier. In wheat they quote a decline of 1/2.

HAVRE, Aug. 11.—The sales of Cotton since Friday, the 7th ult., have reached 4200 bales.

Orleans Treas Ordinance closed at 1/2, and Box at 1/2.

The French wheat crop has greatly improved, but prices for various qualities are lower.

LONDON, Aug. 11.—A moderate business has been done in Money during the past few days. Bank rates were generally unchanged.

Blow Control and Etes steamers had experienced a slight alarm. Hancock & Son, owners in Perth, have suspended payment. The amount of their liabilities is not stated.

NEW YORK, Aug. 11.—A letter by the steamship Adrifatic, from Havre, reports that Cotton is dropping. And the aspect of business is especially gloomy. It says Box closed at 1/2.

General Intelligence.

The Journals of Turin speak of a meeting this month between the King of Sardinia and the Emperor Napoleon. The object of this meeting is to consider the present deplorable condition of Italy, and to adopt certain measures by which France and Sardinia will be able to take several portions of Italy.

On the evening of the 1st, the city of Naples was in a state of tranquillity, but great agitation prevailed in the provinces.

It is rumored that the royal troops are about to evacuate the citadel of Messina, and that hostilities have been suspended for the present.

A letter from Milan says that several Hungarian soldiers were procuring ball cartridges, and had on one occasion fired into a corps of Chassours loyal to the Emperor of Austria, and killed a sergeant.

Several Hungarian officers afterwards deserted. A letter from Damascus to the 10th of July state that 4000 Christians had taken refuge in the citadel occupied by Algerines under Abd-el-Kader.

The city of Damascus is in possession of 2000 mule and incendiaries, numbering in all 2000 men.

The Turkish garrison, composed of 500 men, is either inactive or hostile. The soldiers drove the Christians into the houses of burning houses, and permitted the amount of burning to burn to death. The number of victims is put down at 2000 to 4000. This statement, it is thought, has been exaggerated.

ARRIVAL OF THE OVERLAND EXPRESS.

St. Louis, August 11.—The Central Overland Express, bringing articles from Denver City to the city, has arrived at 11:30 in gold and a great many letters.

The news from the mining districts in the neighborhood of Pike's Peak is generally unpromising. A large quantity of money was leaving for the west.

INSURRECTION AMONG THE NEGROES.

NEW YORK, August 11.—The schooner Emma Tuttle has arrived at this port from San Domingo, Santo Domingo.

She reports that an insurrection has taken place among the negroes employed at San Domingo.

An overseer by the name of Snow was murdered by one of the negroes under his charge. The negro was immediately arrested and sent to the United States on board the American bark Warren, to be tried.

The blacks, infuriated at this conduct on the part of the authorities, rose and took possession of the island, numbering two hundred against twelve whites.
