LINCOLN'S CONGRESS.

Lincoln's Congress, desirably called the Congress of the United States, will meet in extraordinary session on the 4th of July next. Of the duration of the session, and the business to be transacted, the New York Tribune has this to say: It is believed that after the session has begun, all business may be transacted in two days; only three bills will be required, viz: an Army bill, a Navy bill, and a bill to amend the act of 1850, proposing the whole in secret session as adopted, as most probably it will, the members need not be detained here longer than the time specified.

That the loyal subjects in this Congress will implicitly obey his requisitions, there is no sort of doubt. The mock Caesar will have fall away for a brief season. They will rally all he has done, grant all he asks, and in one or two days, in secret or open session, just as he, through his minions, may intimate, the constitutional limits to the power of the French Emperor are as a paper of sand when compared with the chain cables with which all Abolitionism is bound to the ear of the Lincoln despotism.
