General Assembly of Louisiana. The Senate met at noon today, pursuant to adjournment from yesterday. Lieut. Governor Voorhies presided. On the roll being called 21 members responded. Prayer was offered by the Rev. Mr. Beckwith. The journal of yesterday's proceedings was read and approved. During the proceedings the following members were present: Messrs. Mr. Munday, from the Committee on Enrollments, reported correctly enrolled the bill to provide for the better management of the asylum for the deaf, dumb and blind, at Baton Rouge. Mr. Wilcoxson presented a resolution to pay petty expenses to the amount of \$245 41, which was adopted.
