THIRTY-THIRD CONGRESS—FIRST SESSION

WASHINGTON, April 11.—Mr. Sumner offered a resolution, which was adopted, instructing the Military Committee to inquire into the expediency of establishing a system of education for soldiers in the United States Army.

Mr. Wilson introduced a resolution to prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors in the capital building.

Mr. McCallum made a few remarks on the subject which he concluded by saying that he was in favor of wine, whiskey and beer.

Mr. Wilson said that during the last few years the employees of the Capitol had been taxed to keep members of Congress in whiskey, and that the disreputable scenes which had been witnessed about the Capitol of late.

Mr. McCallum said he did not know but that it would be well for the other members from California (Congress) to indulge himself in a little generous wine, but he did not know but it would be better for the Senator from New Hampshire (Clark) to do so also, and he was sure that it would have a kindly influence on the Senator from Massachusetts (Wilson) in his conduct of his duties.

The resolution was adopted by yeas 37, nays 3.

Mr. Sumner introduced a petition signed by congressional all for the Extension and North-eastern railroad connecting Halifax with the United States. Referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations.

The Judiciary committee was discharged from further consideration of the bill protecting officers of the army from civil suits, a bill for that purpose being before Congress.

Mr. Sullybury asked for delay to examine the bill.

Mr. Clark did not believe that the Senators on the other side needed further time to consider the bill. It was evident that they had examined it and made up their minds concerning it.

Mr. Clark called for a relation to qualifications of jurors and writs of error in certain cases. The bill was reported as follows:

That no person shall be disqualified to act as juror or witness in any civil or criminal case, or as an expert witness, provided he be otherwise competent, and shall appear to the satisfaction of the court upon the oath of the juror or witness, or otherwise, that he can and will notwithstanding such an opinion act impartially upon the matter to be submitted to him.

Sec. 2. That any action of law arising upon the trial of any person in any District or Circuit Court of the United States, or in the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia, or in any other court of the United States, and such order or judgment of the court, allowing or reversing its judgment, or the determination of such questions of law may be reviewed.

The bill was postponed till tomorrow.

The bill relative to the *Bellevue* was taken up and after a short debate, was postponed till tomorrow.

The bill providing a relief of \$2,500,000 for naval contracts was read, debated slightly, and postponed till tomorrow.

Mr. Gilman opposed the naval contract relief bill because it was an omnibus bill, with some just claims in it.

Mr. Hendricks said the report was carefully examined and approved.

The bill concerning an active volunteer militia was referred to the Military Committee.

Adjourned.

HOUSE.

Mr. Hendricks of New York, presented the resolution of the House of Assembly of the New York legislature, declaring that the action of the New York Senate on the civil rights bill was approved, and recommending that the President be authorized to veto the bill, notwithstanding the President's veto.

Mr. Schmitt from the Committee on Military Affairs, reported back, with a substitute, the bill to regulate the pay of the army, and asked that it be postponed until the next session for this day forth, and will be disposed of as was ordered.

Mr. Pierce of Massachusetts, offered a resolution, which was adopted, instructing the Judiciary Committee to inquire whether any legislation is necessary to make the shares in national banks liable for attachment, levy, and execution under State laws, for the payment of the debts of the owners.
