Patent Point, May 6.—The steamer Peruvian, from Liverpool, the 25th, via London, the 27th ult., passed the Mersey to-day.

Neither the City of Washington nor the Proprietors, from America, both over due, had arrived when the Peruvian left.

CANTON, CHINA, March 15.—The imperial army has obtained a complete victory over 50,000 rebels, supposed to be the remnants of the Chinese army. The conflict lasted two days. All the rebels were either slain or taken prisoners. The imperial army is now being disbanded.

A Berlin telegram says the prospects of a treaty of alliance between Prussia and Italy are unfavourable.

The attitude of Austria remains unaltered. The Florence journals report that the Austrian government had ordered all the land and naval forces in Vienna to be placed on a war footing by May 1, and an extraordinary concentration of troops was to take place in the province of Rovigo. It was asserted that Napoleon had told the Italian cabinet that he would not assist Italy in case of an attack from Austria.

Private telegrams to the Paris Monitor assert that private arrangements have been made between Austria and Prussia, the latter agreeing to the Austrian proposal for mutual disarmament. The Gazette of Bavaria confirms this, asserting that all hostilities will be suspended, a meeting of the Paris Constitutional assembly the news as being mainly correct.
