EUROPE AT PEACE.

For the moment, Europe is at peace. The war waged with so much fury for a few weeks, has come to an end, and industry has reasserted its sway over society. But, thanks to the energetic nature of the forces which science has accumulated for destructive purposes, and to the vigor with which the campaign was urged by Prussia, as much as would have been effected by the weary length and languid operations of half a dozen years in the last century. Society is not now what society was then. For several centuries conflicting and antagonistic forces have been struggling for the mastery. At one period in the history of Europe, war was its normal condition; because war was the only intelligible solution of international problems among nations which had not risen above the maxims that might makes right. It was, moreover, through the clash of arms and the conflicts of nationalities that peace and order were to be reached. When the standing army was created and the profession of arms was segregated from the professions which a state of peace demanded, progress became possible. From that moment industry commenced to contest the field with war; to assert, in the first place its existence; in the second place, its rights, and finally, its supremacy. When this period was reached, the era of great wars—rather, of long wars, was at an end. If they came, they were no longer the resort of ambitious princes; not even the conflicts of contending sects. They were the culmination of political or social convulsions; or they were waged in the apparent interests of that great industrial system which has obtained the mastery in the civilized world.

STARTLING!

Not that war has broken off again in Europe; not that Africa has been submerged by an earthquake; not that the globe's axis of rotation has changed—O! the world is too much accustomed to sensationalists to be startled from its propriety, by the unexpected clash of arms, or by physical disturbances which could only excite a mild curiosity in the public mind, and set the savans to calculating the nature and intensity of the forces by which such disturbances were produced. Even the conflagration of the Mississippi would lose something of its novelty from those predictions of inviolate creation which have almost convinced the world of the chemical possibility of such an event. The thing is "startling," indeed; but it is not even the metamorphosis of Mr. Sumner into a statesman, or of Mr. Stevens into a philanthropist, wonderful as those conversions would be. What is it, then? In order that our readers may be duly "startled," and not to lessen the effect by any premature exposures, we give the following article from the Hartford Post, just as it appeared in a recent number of that respectable and veracious journal:
