out of season fought the validity of this bond issue, carrying the fight to the Territorial legislature.

Mr. Acker paid all his own expenses in this fight, not calling upon the county to reimburse him for a single cent spent in his long and arduous fight for justice and right. Subsequently, during a term of Congress, Arizona suffered a mental lapse and elected a republican to Congress in place of Mark Smith. During the incumbency of this republican a bill was introduced in Congress and passed which validated these bonds, and today Coconino is paying interest upon \$158,000 of the same, for which she received no benefit whatever.

Boss Acker was born in Michigan, and many years after coming to Arizona met and married a Michigan lady. Mrs Acker was formerly a school teacher, and is a bright, brilliant woman who takes a prominent part in all social and educational work.

It is, therefore, a safe prediction that, if the voters of Coconino county are wise enough to elect Mr. Acker Treasurer, with Mrs Acker as his Assistant, there will be few, if any, mistakes in the three R's in the records of the Treasurer's office.
