The Stanton-Grant Imbroglio—Correspondence between Grant and the President...

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5.—The president and Stanton have had neither written nor personal communication since August 12.

The president's letter to Grant, of January 31, contains the following paragraph: "You had found in our first conference that the president was desirous of keeping Mr. Stanton out of office, whether sustained in the suspension or not. You know what reasons induced the president to ask you on a private basis to do this."

Grant's letter of February 23, alluding to the president's letter of January 31, and newspaper articles, says: "I find it to be a reiteration through somewhat more in detail of the many and gross misrepresentations contained in these articles, and which my statement of the facts set forth in my letter of the 23rd ult., was intended to correct."

APPOINTMENT OF MR. GEO. D. FIELD

Reinstatement of Recorder Gastineau.

The following military orders were issued from headquarters yesterday evening:

HEADQUARTERS FIFTH MILITARY DISTRICT, New Orleans, La., Feb. 5, 1868.

Special Order No. 28. (Extract.)

5. Arthur Gastineau, recorder for the Second District Recorder's Court, city of New Orleans, having been declared by the Supreme Court of Louisiana ineligible to fill said office, when elected, but who is now eligible under the laws of the State, is hereby appointed recorder of said court, provided he fully qualifies and files at this headquarters a copy of the required oaths.
