STANTON RECOGNIZED BY M'COLLOCH.

General Thomas Not at the War Department Yesterday.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 26.—The impeachment articles committee of the House examined General Emory. Serious differences are reported as existing in the committee. The idea that radical resolutions are thickening prevails, though no tangible facts have transpired.

Stanton answered on subpoena that he would obey at noon. As the case was threatened of court no further proceedings were had.

Senate.—Four hundred citizens of Louisiana set forth their grievances in a petition and asked for relief. Referred to the Judiciary committee.

The bill returning criminals from foreign countries was met with considerable opposition. The bill was re-committed, to be more cautiously worded.

The House concurred in the supplemental reconstruction bill, passed yesterday by the Senate. It provides that a majority of voters shall ratify constitutions. Registered persons shall vote anywhere in the State after ten days residence; registration being proved by certificate, affidavit or other evidence; and that congressional and State elections shall be held simultaneously with that of the president.

The House then took up civil appropriations. It includes: Survey of the Atlantic and Gulf coasts, \$2,000,000; Florida roads, \$25,000; Light-house service, \$1,750,000. Without action the House adjourned.

The governor of New Jersey vetoed the resolution withdrawing assent to the 14th article of the amendment to the Constitution.

McColloch honored Stanton's regulations today for various amounts on account of the war department. Gen. Thomas did not go to the war department today.

THIRD DISPATCH.

The President Visited by a Baltimore Committee.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 26.—The committee appointed at a recent meeting in Baltimore, to present certain resolutions relative to the rights of naturalized citizens abroad, this morning visited the executive mansion and presented the resolutions to the president. FROM BALTIMORE.

State Medical Convention.—Nominations.—A Note of Dissent. BALTIMORE, Feb. 26.—The State medical convention to nominate candidates under the Constitution met here today in Tucker Hall. There was a large gathering of friends of the cause.

Mr. Arthur Large, constable of the third judicial circuit, was recently suspended from office by General Hancock upon the recommendation of his excellency Governor Baker, for malfeasance in office.

The police were called out on Mardi Gras, and the result was that peace was preserved. A number of our prominent citizens, among whom we notice the names of Judge Leamon and Judge Durell, have petitioned the governor for the commutation of the sentence of the negro man Charles Joseph, who in a fit of jealousy recently killed his wife.

An adjourned meeting of the Union Army and Navy Association last night a committee of five was appointed to adopt rules and regulations for the organization of a Howard society, and to procure a reading room from foreign countries.

FROM MEXICO, SOUTH AMERICA AND THE WEST INDIES.

Justices Going to Washington, etc., etc. HAVANA, Feb. 26.—Later news from Mexico, Venezuela, Hawaiian Isles, Demerara, Barbados, Trinidad, St. Croix, St. John, Jamaica and St. Thomas has been received.

Several of the new cabinet ministers of Venezuela had resigned. The revolution had not yet been suppressed. A hurricane had occurred at the Island of Navassa. Auction sales of confiscated property have been ordered for the extinguishment of the public debt of Mexico.

Yagu Indians were committing formidable depredations. President Juarez had been granted six months leave of absence to visit Washington. A riot occurred at Puerto Paerito, situated on the Pacific coast, of the State of Oajaca, a port of entry for foreign and coasting commerce.
