The following is a copy of the protest sought to be presented: The undersigned, members of the Forty-third Congress of the United States, representing directly or in principle, more than one-half of the whole people of the United States, do hereby in the name of the just and true majority of the people, solemnly protest against the tyranny and injustice practiced by the majority of the House, in violating the sacred rights of free debate and discussion, and in proceeding to vote upon the greatest question ever brought before the American Congress.

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The undersigned, therefore, in the character of representatives of the people, being inspired by the despotic powers of an inexorable majority of the high privilege of debate—the most cherished heritage of a free people—do hereby solemnly and earnestly protest against their refusal to further most solemnly protest against that wild and radical spirit of innovation upon the early and well-settled practice of the government—a practice established by the men who were the founders of this Republic.
