At a banquet in Richmond, Monday night, given in honor of visitors from New York, addresses were made by Gen. Schofield and citizens of Richmond. The address of Gen. Schofield was a renewed property of Virginia, and the kindly feeling between North and South.

The Herald's special advices from Acapulco, state that Governor Alvarez had levied a forced loan of \$50,000 on the people of that State, and had advanced via the Sierra, according to last accounts, to attack Chilpancingo, in the State of Guerrero.

The suicide of J. S. Brooks, in Newark, Ohio, was made a strange affair. It appeared that he and his father were walking on some little distance from each other in the court-house square, when the young man suddenly stopped, called good by, and then shot himself through the heart. No cause for the suicide has yet been made known.

The Great Water Route for Western Grain. A new route for the transportation of grain from the West to New York, via the Erie Canal and the New York and Pennsylvania Railroad, is being actively promoted.
