ITEMS BY LAST NIGHT'S MAIL.

The receipts at the St. Louis custom house for the fiscal year ending June 30, were \$1,392,331. The receipts of interest revenue, from the 1st to the 25th of July, were \$1,559,900.

Over six hundred thousand acres of land along the Hannibal and St. Joseph railroads have been sold to immigrants during the past six months.

John Thompson, a revolutionary soldier, died at Smithtown, Long Island, on Thursday week, aged 104 years.

Barstow county, New York, has a wild man that wears a long, striped shirt, and a long, pointed hat, in the trees.

Rev. James Rodgers, D. D., one of the oldest clergymen in that vicinity, died at his residence, in Allegheny City, on Thursday, in the sixty-third year of his age.

Rev. W. A. Wilder and wife, and two children, have just arrived in New York from Natal, Africa. He is a missionary of the American Board, and went out in 1849 to the island mission.

About a hundred clerks have been discharged from the quarters of the general office, for lack of appropriations to pay them. They were nearly all soldiers.

A Cheyenne dispatch says several thousand cords of wood, and a large quantity of coal, belonging to the Union Pacific Railroad, were burned on Saturday night.

John M. Wackerman, an old citizen of Buffalo, cut his throat at the Clifton House, Niagara Falls, recently. Domestic and business troubles preceded his suicide.

In Montreal, last week, two hundred and nine persons died mainly of sun-stroke and apoplexy. Prayers were offered for rain, on Sunday, in several of the churches.

Gen. H. D. Mussey has applied, in the Washington courts, for an injunction to restrain St. Marie from receiving ten thousand dollars reward for the information which led to Surratt's arrest.

The Merchants' National Bank, of Memphis, which was closed about a month since for an alleged violation of the national banking act, after an examination by a special agent of the treasury department, has been turned over to its officers, and reopened.

General Buchanan has disapproved of the resolution to appropriate \$15,000 to pay the officers of General Hamilton's provisional government. He has also disapproved of the appropriation of \$50,000 for pay rewards.

Senator Wilson, according to all accounts, got off the narrowest piece of sarcasm the other day that he has seen since long time. He congratulated the Republican party for Europe fooled up to a little over a million last week, making a total of fifty-nine millions since the 1st of January.

On the train between Washington and Vincennes, on the Ohio and Mississippi road, a vote for president was taken recently. The result was as follows: Seymour 63, Grant 38; veteran soldiers for Seymour 11, for Grant 5.

The Democratic campaign was opened in Cincinnati on the 24th by an immense ratification meeting. Speeches were made by Messrs. Pendleton, Pugh and Jepp. Mr. Pendleton was very warmly received. He said he approved of everything done by the 4th of July convention.

James Parton, in the Atlantic Monthly, has given answers with "no" to the question, "Will the coming man drink wine?" A capital temperance article, and as candid an admission as could be looked for from the Hub that Grant will not be Andy Johnson's successor.

An Illinois paper says: "Not one of our present Congressmen, unless it be Gen. Logan, was born in Illinois; Senator Trumbull is from Connecticut; Senator Yates was born in Kentucky; so was Governor Oglesby; and all the rest of our State officers, including the judges of the Supreme Court, were born in other states."

Prior to adjournment Mr. Butler struggled to get the floor to reply to Mr. Henderson, who had denounced him as a thief, falsifier and slanderer. Why Mr. Colfax refused Butler the floor is not known, but there is an intimation that Mr. Colfax intended the charges. The radical admit that here were at least three hundred negroes present, who listened with great interest to the speeches, and many of whom, before leaving the ground, declared their determination to adhere to their white Southern friends and vote the Democratic ticket."

The health of John Minor Botts has been nearly restored, and he will leave Saratoga in a few days for Long Branch, and then return to his home. Seba Smith, the original Major Jack Downing, and husband of Mrs. Elizabeth Oakes Smith, is not expected to live from day to day. A large mass meeting of Democrats was held recently at the Academy of Music, Brooklyn, to ratify the nomination of Seymour and Blair. The mother of President Hopkins, of Williams College, died on Tuesday of last week at the advanced age of ninety-five years. There was a grand Democratic ratification meeting, firing of guns, and illumination at Iverville, in the town of Greene, on Monday. A colored Democratic club has been formed there. Stevens calls Greeley a scarecrow. Greeley calls Stevens a blackleg. Forney calls Cameron an old villain, and Cameron declares Forney is a rascal. Which nobody can deny.
