COMMON COUNCIL.

BOARD OF ALDERMEN.

REGULAR SESSION.

CITY HALL, NEW ORLEANS, September 1, 1888.

The board met pursuant to adjournment.

Present—President Markey and Messrs. Brady, Kaiser, Pesson, Poynot and Shields—6.

The minutes were read and approved.

The petition of G. J. Preret and J. Brawn for compensation in the matter of the Water Works was referred to the finance committee.

The following resolution offered by Mr. Poynot: WHEREAS, The term for which the city physicians elected by the Common Council on the 30th June, 1888, has not been specified; and...

WHEREAS, It is customary to proceed to said elections every two years, and it is proper that the term of said office be fixed;

Resolved, That the term of office for which city physicians are elected be two years, to date from their entering upon the discharge of their respective functions.

Was adopted on first reading, and the rules being waived, read the second time and adopted by the following vote: Yeas—President Markey, and Messrs. Boguille, Brady, Kaiser, Pesson, Poynot, Prados and Shields—8.

Nays—None.

The following resolution, offered by Mr. Brady: Resolved, That the controller shall hereafter prepare four books, corresponding with the division of the tax bills in the treasurer's office, to wit: One from A to E, one from E to I, one from I to P, and one from P to Z, wherein the names of delinquent tax payers shall be at once entered, after the taxation required by law is provided; that for the taxes payable this year and now overdue, as above furnished, be prepared, in addition to the book or index already used, two books, one from L to P and one from Q to Z.

The following, from the finance committee, was read and received: FINANCE COMMITTEE (ROOM, No. 23 City Hall, New Orleans, Sept. 1, 1888.)

To the Honorable the President and members of the Board of Aldermen: The finance committee beg leave to report as follows on the different subjects referred to them:

1. On the resolution authorizing the mayor and chairman of the finance committee to contract for the printing of blank checks for the city, unfavorably. A substitute authorizing the controller to advertise for sealed proposals for the same is offered.

2. On the petition of the Hebrew Education Society, praying to be released from paying the taxes for 1887, imposed upon the lots situated on Callopie street, between St. Charles and Prytanis streets, favorably by resolution.

3. On the petition of the Southwestern Bible Society, praying to be relieved from the payment of taxes for the year 1887 on the property known as the Bible House and Southwestern Bible Society, favorably by resolution.

All of which is respectfully submitted. In H. BRADY, Chairman pro tem. Finance Committee.

The accompanying resolution, exempting Southwestern Bible Society from taxation, was, on motion, rejected.
