FOUR BARRIERS, WYOMING TERRITORY, August 24, 1868.

Dear Sir—I have received your letter, in which you ask me if I would endeavor to have the constitutionality of the reconstruction acts tested by the Supreme Court before proceeding to treat them as null and void.

In that case it was decided, in the plain language of the Constitution, that the government could not establish martial law in time of peace, or try a citizen by military commission, or court martial.
