FROM WASHINGTON.

Twenty-five Millions Gold Paid by the United States Treasurer—Gen. Rousseau Reports All Quiet—Reports from Freedmen's Bureau, etc.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 2.—Warrants for \$23,735,000 coin were issued from the treasury today to pay the interest on 5-20's.

Gen. Rousseau telegraphed Schofield today that all is quiet in New Orleans, and that he has no apprehensions for tomorrow.

Reports from agents of the freedmen's bureau have been received, including that of Gen. Hatch from Louisiana, who says it is mainly owing to the incompetency, inefficiency and misconduct of the civilian employees of the bureau that it has become so unpopular, and the freedmen suffered for so much in many of the parishes here.

Gen. Hatch says up to date that he has no apprehensions for tomorrow.

Superintendent Kennedy has issued a general order directing the police to take persons arrested for illegal voting before the United States commissioners, instead of the city and state courts.

Registration of the city foots up 189,000.

Sheriff Campbell, of Brooklyn, has, under instructions from Mayor Kalbfleisch, sworn in 2000 deputies.

The excitement at police headquarters continues, but nothing additional relative to Superintendent Kennedy's order has yet been made public.

Gen. McDowell has issued a circular requesting all officers from other commands visiting or temporarily residing in this city to report to his headquarters.

Report says the Erie Railway Company has bought Pike's Opera House for \$500,000, and contemplates establishing their offices in the front building, retaining the Opera House proper for its legitimate purposes.

The United States grand jury have found nine additional indictments against persons charged with having disposed of fraudulent naturalization papers, five of them against Rosenberg, each being based on naturalization papers, and others against persons yet unnamed.

Each has been admitted to bail by Commissioner Betts in \$5000 on a similar charge.

Several other parties have been treated likewise, both in New York and Jersey City.
