Democratic State Convention.

First Day's Proceedings.

New Orleans, November 10, 1868.

In pursuance to a resolution adopted by the Democratic State Convention, at its session of the 24 day of October last, the convention met at 12 o'clock m. at the Hall of the Deutsche Company, in this city.

The convention was called to order by the Hon. Andrew S. Herron, its president, in the chair. On a call of the roll it appeared that the following parishes were duly represented:

The parish of Assumption 4 delegates, Avoyelles 5, St. Charles 4, Claiborne 4, Calcasieu 1, East Baton Rouge 6, Franklin 3, Iberville 4, Lafayette 3, Lafourche 6, Livingston 4, Natchitoches 7, Orleans, First Ward 3, Second Ward 1, Third Ward 10, Fourth Ward 5, Fifth Ward 5, Sixth Ward 5, Seventh Ward 3, Eighth Ward 3, Ninth Ward 3, Tenth Ward 3, Eleventh Ward 3, Orleans right bank 2, Plaquemines 2, Pointe Coupee 4, St. Bernard 1, St. Helena 3, St. Landry 3, St. Martin 6, St. Mary 5, St. Tammany 5, Terrebonne 5, West Baton Rouge 3. Total 154 members present, being a majority of 254 members elected to the convention.

On motion of Mr. Geo. W. Race, the president was requested to fill the vacancies in the committee on resolutions.

Whereupon the president appointed Mr. Joseph Ellison of New Orleans, in the place of Mr. Robert W. Walker of West Feliciana; Mr. W. F. Blackman of Claiborne, in the place of Mr. John McEnery; and Mr. B. B. Simmes of Pointe Coupee, in the place of Mr. W. W. Pugh of Lafourche.

The president laid before the convention a letter from Mr. Mandeville Marigny, a delegate from the First Ward of Orleans, who is suffering from sickness from attending the sessions of the convention, appointing in his stead Mr. Albert Fabre, of said ward, as his proxy.

On motion of Mr. A. W. Walker of St. Bernard, the same was accepted.

Mr. Campbell of Orleans, submitted a preamble and resolutions in relation to the election of a State Central Democratic Committee, which were referred to the committee on resolutions.

Mr. Lagan, of Orleans, submitted to the convention a preamble and resolutions on the same subject matter, which were also read and referred to the committee on resolutions.

Mr. Fabre, of Orleans, submitted a resolution providing for the appointment of the members of the State Central Democratic Committee, which was read and ordered to be referred to the same committee.

On motion of Mr. Favrot, of West Baton Rouge, the delegates were authorized to submit such resolutions as they may think proper to the same committee.

On their respective motions Mr. Duncan S. Cagle, of Terrebonne, was excused from serving upon the committee on permanent organization, and Mr. Joseph Ellison was also excused from serving upon the committee on resolutions.

Mr. E. L. Bower, of Orleans, presented resolutions in reference to the charges made by the Republican party against the Democratic party in regard to the late presidential election, which were read and ordered to be referred to the committee on resolutions.
