THURSDAY MORNING, NOVEMBER 26, 1898. The Birmingham of Russia. (Correspondence from the N. Y. Evening Post.)

The Russian Birmingham, as Tulsa is often called, lies about one hundred and twenty miles south of Moscow, on the great Southern Railway.

It is the capital of the government of Tulsa, and has a population of about fifty-five thousand. It is situated on the banks of the Tulsa River, which is a tributary of the great Southern Railway.

The government is one of the most extensively built and worst managed roads in Russia. After talking about three times as long as for a private road, it is now open with a single track as far as Kurak, three hundred and forty miles with a possibility of being opened to Kiev in December, and to Odessa next summer.

The time tables have been so managed all summer as to deter rather than attract travel. Finding that Tarsitzyo was becoming a place of resort, the direction ran six or seven special trains per month; and by refusing to sell tickets by other trains on those days, an excellent traffic was secured.
