Increasing ease is still the most noticeable feature of the money market. There is no let up in the accumulation of currency and no improvement in the demands for accommodation.

GOLD AND SILVER - The specie market has been quite unsettled throughout the week, owing to the frequent and at times heavy fluctuations in rates at New York.

FOREIGN EXCHANGE - There has been a steady business transacted from day to day at the Exchange. Offerings of commercial sight and short sight have been liberal, and the remittance demand, especially on the part of Western banks, has been steady throughout.

CURRENCY NOTES AND SECURITIES - There has been less activity noticeable under the above heading during the past three days than heretofore. The offering supply indicated but little if any change, however, but the demand has been of a more restricted character.

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COTTON STATEMENT.

Stock on hand September 1, 1898. 1,000 bales. Reported on October 1, 1898. 1,100 bales.

Exports to day were divided as follows, viz: 260 bales for Marseilles, 700 bales for Barcelona, 1100 bales for New York, 2000 bales for Boston and 3100 bales for Havre.

Imports - We have to report this market as almost without change, but it has been somewhat since our last. The new crop is arriving very slowly, receipts being very light.

SUGAR AND MOLASSES - The market has been rather unsettled the last three days. On Saturday the market declined, but it has since been done up.

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
