JACKSON, Miss., Jan. 6.—J. K. Lacey, charged with embezzling fifteen thousand dollars from Martin Keary, internal revenue collector of this district, attempted to resist Dr. Winter, U. S. marshal, in arresting him. Lacey drew his pistol and ordered the marshal to stand back. Winter promptly drew a police revolver and shot Lacey through the head, fracturing the skull. Dr. Craft dressed the wound, which may prove fatal. Considerable excitement prevails.

Major Sumner, commanding the post, furnished a guard to disperse the crowd and restored order.

The marshal surrendered himself to the sheriff and is undergoing a preliminary examination before Judge Yerger.

Several prominent citizens came forward to sign any bond that might be required.
