GENERAL NEWS ITEMS.

The clerk of the Hastings Court, of Lynchburg, Virginia, on Saturday week, issued a license to Frank Gooden to marry Mary Pugh Thwaitt, aged seventy years.

When an officer of the American army reaches the age of sixty, and his further usefulness becomes doubtful, he is placed upon the retired list.

Springfield, Indiana, has discharged its entire police force in compliance with a resolution of the board of city trustees.

The Merchants' National Bank of Little Rock, Arkansas, has been reorganized.

The Paris correspondent of the Crescent writes that the Russian ambassador in London has been notified of the appointment of a new minister to Paris.

John Lanes, of Concord, N. H., has recovered a verdict of \$1153.33 against Comfort and Iahod, his mother-in-law and brother-in-law, for ending his wife's life.

BOARD OF ASSISTANT ALDERMEN. EXTRA SESSION. CITY HALL, NEW ORLEANS, JANUARY 30, 1893.

The board met in extra session pursuant to adjournment. Mr. Green in the chair, and the following members present: Messrs. Rose, Aitkens, Walker, Camp, Storcken, Grandpre, Fisher, Morphy, Pandy, Wynne and Farrell.

To the Honorable the Board of Assistant Aldermen: Gentlemen—Your special committee to which was referred a series of resolutions in the matter of the late sale of the revenues of the markets, and of the conduct of the mayor in the premises, beg leave to report that they have not had sufficient time to carefully examine the subject, and respectfully ask for further time to make their final report and take the benefit of proper legal advice.
