To Stop the River's Overflow Will Cost \$9 Per Acre.

Engineer Wright Gives Figures From Official Survey.

LEVEES IS BEST PLAN.

Thinks Mammoth Reservoirs at Emporia Impractical.

A Partial Straightening of the Channel Would Aid.

Chanute, Kan., Oct. 24.—The great question in southeast Kansas is being settled in meetings held this week in different towns to take into consideration propositions to curb the overflow of the Neosho river.

By request of Congressman Campbell the United States government has taken charge of the work to curb the river.

Nine dollars per acre is the amount which J. O. Wright, government engineer, stated at the meeting here, would be required to render Neosho county bottom land, now valued at \$30, well for \$75 to \$100 an acre.

His plan embraces a partial straightening of the channel of the stream and a complete system of levees, sluice gates were needed to regulate the flow on the river.

On all lateral streams he would build wing levees and on those having a great fall, construct a sluice gate.

During flood times, he calculates that the water shed of the Neosho, comprising 5,500 miles, sends 50,000 cubic feet of water down the channel of the river a second, while the stream is only capable of disposing of approximately 30,000 when bank full.

To dispose of this surplus of 50,000 cubic feet per second, four plans might be adopted.
