

USED BLUE PENCIL.

How Dr. Angell Slaughtered Articles Written by John Hay.

Ann Arbor, Mich., March 20.—An interesting anecdote, linking the lives of President James B. Angell of the University of Michigan, the late John Hay and President Lincoln, is published in the current number of the Michigan Alumnus, the organ of the University of Michigan alumni.

When Dr. Angell was editor of the Providence, R. I. Journal, his first glimpse of Lincoln was on the occasion of Lincoln's famous Cooper institute speech. Up to this time, says the Alumnus, Dr. Angell confesses that he was at one with the popular unfavorable impression which seems to have prevailed throughout the east, owing to the awkwardness of Lincoln's personal appearance.

To bring the candidate before the public in the most favorable light, Lincoln's appearance was so apt to make in the critical east. Dr. Angell employed his young friend, John Hay, who was then a student at the office at that time, to write for the Journal a series of articles which should emphasize the sterling qualities of the man rather than his fame as a rail splitter.

Mr. Hay, however, was so impressed with the contrast between Lincoln's mind and his mannerisms that even he emphasized too strongly the "rail splitter" in Lincoln and the articles were merely blue penciled by Editor Angell.

These articles, as they appeared in the Providence Journal, says the Alumnus, may be taken as evidence as giving John Hay's early impressions of the man whose secretary and biographer he was later to become. As the articles were not signed their historical interest has never been brought out.

MALLORY TO PARSONS.

Topeka Preacher Delivers First Sermon There Tomorrow.

Rev. Frank E. Mallory, who has been pastor of the Third Christian church for the past 15 years, left this morning for Parsons, Kan., where he will preach his first sermon Sunday to his new congregation in the First Christian church. Fifteen years ago Mr. Mallory came to Topeka to take charge of the little Christian church on the east side of the city.

He was successful and the church has grown steadily under his direction until it is now one of the largest churches in that section of the city. From time to time he was re-elected to fill the same pulpit and only resigned because he was offered a greater salary by the Parsons congregation than his Topeka followers felt justified in promising.

The last Sunday in December a delegation of Parsons citizens known to the Topeka pastor visited his church and listened to his sermon. Then came a letter offering him the Parsons pastorate at an advanced salary and what he was receiving in Topeka but the advance was not tempting enough to cause him to leave his old charge.

A few weeks later another offer with a higher salary reached him and he decided to make the change which caused his departure from the city this morning.

The year following his advent as pastor of the Third Christian church in Topeka he was elected a member of the Topeka school board of which he was a member at the time he left for Parsons. For five years he served as president of the board. He also served as president of the Christian missionary board for four years.

During his residence in Topeka Mr. Mallory has been very interested in every enterprise which was of benefit to the section of the city in which he lived, and where his charge was located.

KILLED BY MISTAKE.

Chicago Police Shot Husband of Young Woman.

Chicago, March 20.—A fragile woman with an eight-month-old baby is today mourning the loss of her husband, Joseph Finn, 24 years old, who lies dead because Alexander Scott, a policeman, mistook him for "Pickles" Kilroy, a suspected robber, and shot him. Immediately after the killing Scott realized his mistake, notified his station, surrendered and was held in custody pending the coroner's investigation.

When he was informed that the widow of his victim, with her child in her arms, was waiting and wondering why her husband did not come home to supper, he was overcome and it was some time before he could explain the shooting in detail. He said he fired only after Finn refused to stop upon being ordered to surrender and had made a motion as if to draw a weapon. Kilroy is much older than the man whose life was ended.

FIGHT WITH A BEAR.

Minneapolis Scrap Terminated With Shotgun.

Minneapolis, March 20.—A bear fought a crowd of citizens in the streets yesterday and after a long battle was killed. The bear, which probably came down the Northern Pacific track or the river, was discovered by a boy who saw the animal hiding under a box car.

An alarm was given and a crowd gathered. It was suggested that the animal be captured alive and men with ropes and clubs surrounded it. Once brought to bay, the bear made such attacks upon the crowd that none dared approach. It was finally killed with a shotgun.
