Kansas City's vast Convention hall, greatly enlarged by interior additions to promenade and display space, will be the stage next week of the largest, most attractive motor show that will be given in the west this year.

It's the fourth annual Automobile show of the Kansas City Automobile Dealers' association, comprising really all of the motor tradesmen of Kansas City.

Scenes In Streets of Philadelphia During Great Strike of Trolley Men.



Scenes of great violence marked the opening of the great trolley car strike in Philadelphia. Cars were smashed and burned by the strikers and their sympathizers, and riots in many parts of the city sent scores of persons to the hospitals. In one day a woman and two girls were hit by stray bullets and about 500 persons were arrested. In many cases it was only by the use of powerful streams of water in the hands of firemen that the crowds were dispersed. Several men were badly injured by being hurled against buildings by the force of the currents. The strike arose over the questions of wages, recognition of a carmen's union and the discharge of about 200 union men.
