TO OLD SOLDIERS:

I want you to know the exact facts as to whether I am your friend or not.

Reports have been circulated to my injury. Numerous complaints came to me soon after my election last spring that Mr. Hawkins, the meat inspector, was incompetent.

I talked it over with him and asked him, in order to satisfy those making complaints, to take the Civil Service examination the following day, and if he passed he could stay as long as I did.

He refused to do so on the grounds they would not treat him fairly. (He did, however, do so in December, and passed a good examination before the same men.)

The consolidation of his office with that of the inspector of weights was suggested in July by Mr. Bone, to save the city \$1,000 per year, and was agreed to by all the commissioners.

I am charged with being the instigator of this, which you can see is not true. Mr. Bone was right in suggesting it, and I was loyal to the city's interest in voting for it.




