RATE CASE DECISION.

The I. C. C. Promises to Hand It Down Before Night

Washington, Aug. 1.—It was announced today at the interstate commerce commission "that every effort would be made to publish the decision in the eastern advance freight rate case" at or after 4 p. m. today.

The announcement, signed by the secretary of the commission, was posted at the general offices and it was said it would stand for the day. Anticipating attempts to forecast the decision, officials said any reports purporting to give the commission's conclusion in the case would be wholly unauthorized and speculative.

The decision, affecting fifty-two railway systems east of the Mississippi and north of the Potomac and Ohio rivers, in what is designated as official classification territory, has been under consideration several months, and an announcement has been expected from day to day for the last six weeks.

The railroads have asked the increase solely on the ground that their revenues have become insufficient to meet the increasing cost of wages and other expenses. Opposition to the increase has been conducted on the ground that the railroads would have sufficient revenue without increasing the charges to the public by conserving their revenue with greater efficiency and eliminating free services to large shippers.

WANT TO GET HOME.

American Tourists Abandon Sightseeing in Europe.

London, Aug. 1.—American tourists in England entirely gave up their sight seeing trips today and flocked to Cocker street, where the headquarters of the trans-Atlantic steamship companies are situated, to try to book passage home. The one object of the American travelers appeared to be to get home as soon as possible. Maximum rates were charged by all the companies, and many passengers paid high premiums for tickets to those who had them but preferred taking the profit in the hope of getting home later at a lower rate.

The French trans-Atlantic line and the North German Lloyd still accepted bookings for their steamers today, but most of the passengers seemed to prefer British vessels. The Hamburg American and other German companies have ordered their vessels in all parts of the world to seek neutral ports.

Thomas Nelson Page, American ambassador to Italy, who had booked on the Imperator, decided today to return to Rome in view of the critical situation.

WHERE'S MR. TREADWEL

Former Subscriber of State Journal Is Missing His Paper.

The State Journal is unable to locate one of its subscribers. The lost subscriber is C. S. Treadwell, who last got his paper at Llanco, Sonora, Mexico.

It is thought that Mr. Treadwell was among the Americans forced to leave Sonora on account of the war. The July 13 paper that was returned from Llanco bore the following message from the postmaster there:

"No Reclamado—Devuelto. Cambio residencia al destinatario. Es inutil signa remitendo mas ejemplares con esta direccion."

Translated, the notice reads: "Unclaimed—Returned. The addressee has changed residence. It is useless to continue sending copies to this address."

TRY TO BLOW UP CHURCH

Suffragettes Explode Dynamite Under Cathedral Window.

Belfast, Ireland, Aug. 1.—Militant suffragettes today disobeyed the order issued by the Women's Social and Political union requesting members to refrain from militant acts during the international crisis and made an attempt to destroy the ancient cathedral at Lisburn, which contains a monument of Lieutenant Dobbs, killed during the engagement against Admiral John Paul Jones's ship.

The women placed dynamite beneath a window of the chancel. A very rare stained glass window was shattered by the explosion.
